4-C's VISION: All children have equitable access to world-class early care and education.

4-C's MISSION: Believing that child care is critical to social well-being and economic development, 4-C advocates for an equitable and innovative education system while supporting early childhood professionals who work to meet the needs of families with young children.

Year in Review

- 4-C sponsored 79 Family Child Care Home Providers in the USDA's Child and Adult Care Food Program that received \$451,011 in meal reimbursement in return for serving 309,232 nutritious meals and snacks to children in their programs.
- 4-C also sponsored 25 Child Care Centers in the USDA's Child and Adult Care Food Program that received \$745,720 in meal reimbursement in return for serving 539,081 nutritious meals and snacks to children in their programs.
- 4-C's Information and Referral programs match parents seeking child care with local child care providers that meet their family's needs. Our website provides 24 hour access to valuable tools and information about child care services, training events, news, advocacy alerts, abuse prevention, etc.
- 4-C's Training Department offered professional development opportunities for child care providers via face-to-face workshops, independent study modules, customized on-site workshops, community conferences, Communities of Practice, etc. to 2,880 participants from all over the state who attended 515 unique training events where they were provided with a total of 2,891 clock hours of training.
- 4-C also offers Shared Services which provides a wide range of financial management, human resource and administrative support to child care centers, and access to the Kentucky Shared Services on-line platform.
- Some program offerings of note for this year include: partnering with Family & Children's Place to carry out the work of the Greater Louisville Head Start program in select child care centers with on-site and intensive professional development and mentoring for Head Start and Early Head Start staff; partnering with KYA in the Face It® movement to help recognize and end child abuse; partnering with the James Graham Brown and C.E. and S. Foundations in the Pathways to Excellence program to support child care centers in low-income areas of Jefferson County with professional development opportunities.
