Professional Development for Educators

4-C's Training Department offered professional development opportunities for child care providers via face-to-face workshops, online eCourses, customized on-site workshops, community conferences, and Communities of Practice (monthly cohort meetings), etc. We also offer a hybrid model CDA program through which child care professionals can obtain their CDA (Child Development Associate) Credential. In total for this year, 5,301 statewide participants attended 1,212 unique training events where they were provided with a total of 3,370 clock hours of training.

Food Program for Child Care Centers & Homes

4-C sponsored 39 Child Care Centers in the USDA's Child and Adult Care Food Program that received \$1,235,782 in meal reimbursement in return for serving 622,178 nutritious meals and snacks to children in their programs and 58 Family Child Care Home Providers that received \$492,616 in meal reimbursement in return for serving 218,274 nutritious meals and snacks to children in their programs.

Head Start Coaching Services

4-C, working under a contract with Family & Children's Place, provided the Greater Louisville Head Start program -- a free program that helps nearly 400 families each year by enhancing each child's growth and development, strengthening parents' ability to nurture their child, connecting families with needed community resources, and providing children with educational, health, and nutritional services -- with various coaching and professional development services in several partner child care centers around Louisville this year.

Family Child Care Network

4-C is one of five agencies in Kentucky tasked with supporting and recruiting family child care providers to build and protect the unique care offered by child care providers in their homes. Our staff offer support and resources throughout the application process, assist with grant applications, and develop professional development opportunities specifically designed for family child care providers under this contract with Western Kentucky University.



Advocacy

4-C maintains a pro-active public policy program, with the goal of influencing local, state, and national child care policies and serves as a voice for children and families. We carry out these program goals by identifying and developing resources for families and child care programs; partnering with business, government, and communities to demonstrate that child care is critical to social wellbeing and economic development; and collecting, developing and disseminating information about child care programs.

Help for Families

4-C's Information and Referral program matches parents seeking child care with local child care providers that meet their family's needs. Our website provides access to valuable tools and information about child care services, training events, news, advocacy alerts, and abuse prevention, among others.



Child Care Business Aids

4-C offers Shared Services to a few local child care programs, providing them with a wide range of financial management, human resource, and administrative supports. In addition, we offer access to the KY Shared Services on-line resource platform that currently serves over 700 members in Kentucky counties all over the Commonwealth.
